WHAT YOU WILL RECEIVE · V1.0 · PENDING FOUNDER SIGN-OFF

The Practitioner intake is an application, not an appointment. It exists so ORVIA can build a practitioner base carefully — one named person at a time, on documented standards — rather than by aggregating a marketplace.

The deliverable

1. Written acknowledgement within five working days

Signed by the ORVIA Founder.

2. A structured first conversation

Not an interview — a mutual read of fit, values and capacity.

3. A vetting and references stage

Only if both sides want to continue.

4. A signed Practitioner Standards agreement

Before any ORVIA work is assigned.

5. A staged first engagement

First engagement runs alongside the Founder or a senior practitioner.

How it moves

This service follows the ORVIA enquiry journey — every enquiry passes Gate One (suitability), then Gate Two (controlled onboarding) before any evidence is examined. See the How it works page on orvia.org.uk for the full flow.

Every issued document carries a named ORVIA reviewer, a Founder sign-off, a version number and a date. Findings are footnoted to the source material supplied to us.
